Hello all,

Just a quick update on my visit to Okada this week now that I'm back in Toronto:

All 17 Bays are aligned!

They look great.

Bays 49 – 64 have been done manually with the Warper in Pandoras Box.

Bay 65 has been done in Mystique – this bay was moved back about 3m from the windows and doesn't need blending anymore.

- I was able to use Mystique to converge the projectors on this bay in about 20 minutes – including all of the configuration time in Pandoras Box.

The 17 Bays are now part of one large canvas with 57 being in the center.

What this means is now when we're using content that is not developed for the corridor, the system will now act as one large screen instead of 17 individual ones.

This gives us flexibility to easily animate layers across the entire canvas

Take the Alpha Dragon we had on top of the PhilPano scene for example;

Initially this took about 2 hours to program to look correct – offsetting several layers correctly to make it look as if there was one dragon flying around.

Now, this should not take any longer than 10 or 15 minutes.

Content developed for the corridor will still be displayed correctly.

As JP has reported, all Phase 1 content is playing back.

This content has all been programmed inside of Playlists now; this will make it easier to edit in the future through the Widget.

This essentially means that instead of having to go to 76 Players to edit 15 pieces of content per Player, one will now need only to go into the Widget and make the necessary changes there one time, and these changes will populate to all of the Playlists on all of the Players.

We've also increased the scale of the Playlists to be 10px wider on the left and right (overshoot) to take the large beams that aren't being projected on into account.

Now a fish will look like it is swimming through the beam instead of skipping it.

JP has a list of things to complete this week, and so far it sounds like he's well on his way.
